Your Voice, Their Future

Children have no political voice or lobbying power; therefore, we must be their voice. Speaking up in support of services for children and families is challenging, but empowering. Our leaders need feedback from parents, child care providers and other community members to make informed decisions.


Express Yourself

You don't have to be an expert on government or public policy issues to be an effective advocate. The key is to make your voice heard. The information in this handout can get you started. You can visit, write or call your elected officials to express your opinions or provide input that might help them understand how certain policies affect you, your children or your business.

If you would like to meet with an elected official, it is best to call ahead for an appointment. Though you can often just drop by, you will have more time to talk if you request a meeting. Either way, plan what you are going to say. You may want to encourage him/her to vote for or against a specific bill or support funding for a specific program. It's helpful to state the number and author of the bill (example: SB200 Watson, Child Care Bond Issue) or the specific funding you want protected. Bring written information that you can leave with the representative to help him/her remember what you discussed.

When you visit, give your name and the name of your organization (if appropriate) to the receptionist. Briefly state your concern and ask to see the elected official. Sometimes a representative is not available and a member of his/her staff will speak with you. Representatives instruct their staff to keep track of all calls and visits they receive, so the time you spend does make a difference.

You can also write a letter to express your thoughts on an issue. Elected officials like to receive letters from their constituents. Letters should be personal, brief, timely and specific. Even if you are very angry, avoid threatening language and, instead, explain how you are affected by an issue. Use the correct name and title of the representative and include your return address, phone number and email address.



How To Get Involved

- Write, call or email your elected officials about your concerns
- Visit your elected official's office
- Learn how the budget process works
- Attend a public hearing
- Register to vote
- Become informed on issues affecting children and share this information with friends and family
- Encourage your employer to offer familyfriendly policies (parental leave, flexible schedules and job sharing)
- Plan family-friendly events to raise awareness about children's issues

Writing To Your Representative: A Sample Letter

Dear Senator/Assembly member (member's last name):

I am writing to urge you, as my representative, to vote in favor of (example: Senate Bill 200) which will be heard in the Senate this month.

This bill would provide more funding to assist parents with their child care payments and provide a safe and healthy environment for children.

Parents need child care so they can go to work and provide for their families. Because child care is very expensive, families need assistance paying for their child care costs. I personally know many parents must work and many leave their children home alone because they can't afford child care costs. All children deserve the right to a safe and supervised environment. We all know what can happen, and what has happened, when children are left alone.

Please vote in favor of Senate Bill 200. I would appreciate your response, and thank you for your consideration.
